ABI's PAC endorses Jeff Vander Werff as a Friend of Iowa Business

The Iowa Association of Business and Industry's (ABI) political action committee is pleased to announce its endorsement of Jeff Vander Werff as a Friend of Iowa Business. Vander Werff is running in Iowa House District 4. The endorsement was made after a rigorous review process.

Candidates are evaluated based on support for a competitive business climate and a focus on a regulatory climate conducive for job creation. Criteria used to make the Friend of Iowa Business designations include candidates' positions on issues based on interviews, stated approach to general business community concerns, voting records for incumbent candidates, as well as input from ABI members and contributors to the Iowa Industry Political Action Committee (IIPAC).

He has expressed a commitment to support a business and regulatory climate in Iowa so that employers can create more jobs and grow the economy," ABI President Mike Ralston said. IIPAC is nonpartisan and endorses candidates for legislative office who support pro-growth policies in the state. The IIPAC committee, which is comprised of IIPAC contributors and makes the final Friend of Iowa Business selections, encourages voters to consider these endorsements when evaluating which candidates will focus on economic issues and help bring jobs to Iowa when voting this November.
